Desired Qualifications:

- Interest or experience in instructing planting, nature education activities or activities including biology, botany, or related areas
- Ability to set up demonstration area and program, and to teach skills to staff and campers of all ages
- Desire and willingness to work with children
- Ability to accept guidance and supervision
- Good character, integrity, and adaptability
- 18 years of age or older

Responsible to: Outdoor Adventure Coordinator

General Responsibility

To teach and coordinate camp's nature program, create ability for campers/staff to make connections between self, community, earth, and spirit with a socially and environmentally conscious program

Specific Responsibilities

- Be available for 5 hours of remote pre-camp planning in May and June
- Participate in Staff Week June 17-21, 2024
- Actively participate in staff trainings and meetings.
- Assist in conducting initial and end-of-season inventory.
- Assist Garden specialist with pre-camp garden work, as needed in April-June 2024
- Prepare lesson plans a week in advance and review with the Outdoor Adventure Coordinator to
 ensure materials needed are available, aspirational arcs are being set, and activities are age
 appropriate
- Implement creative weekly lesson plans by unit and age group for Nature and Archery that are infused with the Jewish value (middah) of the week
- Prepare for and lead week-long chugim (club) for 3rd-8th grade campers throughout the summer
- Responsible for safety during all nature activities; including plant identification, supervision on nature hikes, etc.
- Assist in shut down procedures and packing all materials and supplies at end of season
- Must attend and plan for at least one after camp extra programming (late stay or overnight) –
 additional compensation provided
- Be a positive, contributing member of the specialist team
- Required to complete Archery certification course prior to the start of camp (training provided)
- Be a positive, contributing member of the specialist team

Additional Responsibilities

- Set a good example for campers including cleanliness, punctuality, sharing cleanup and chores, and sportsmanship.
- Follow camp rules and regulations
- Encourage respect for personal property, camp equipment and facilities.
- Manage personal time off in accordance with camp policy.
- Additional responsibilities as assigned



Compensation:

• \$3,000 – \$4,500 depending on experience

Bonuses: In order to be eligible for any bonus you must work a minimum of 6 weeks

- \$700 bonus if you miss 10% of days or less of contracted time to work, age 18+
- \$250 All Star bonus
- \$250 bonus if you refer a friend to work at camp
- Bonuses will be awarded in final paycheck at the discretion of the camp director
